## How to Recycle Plastic Bags and Film Packaging

FIRST - reuse as much plastic bags, packaging, and plastic film that you can.

**Recycle what you can't.** Put **small amounts** of clean, dry, stretchable, non-crinkly, **plastic bags** (clear or colored) and **polyethylene films** listed below = labels can be left on - **inside carry-out bags** and place them in bins labeled "Recycle Plastic Bags" usually located in or near the entries of participating stores.

## **DO INCLUDE:**

- ✓ Pallet wrap & stretch film
- ✓ Grocery bags
- ✓ Case soda overwrap
- ✓ Dry cleaning bags
- ✓ Newspaper sleeves
- ✓ Ziploc & other bags that close
- ✓ Produce bags
- ✓ Product wrap
- ✓ Retail bags
- ✓ Bubble wrap
- ✓ Air cushion wrap
- ✓ Plastic shipping envelopes (labels OK)
- ✓ Ice bags
- ✓ Electronic wrap
- ✓ Wood pellet bags
- ✓ Cereal box liners

## **DO NOT INCLUDE:**

- Net or mesh produce bags
- **Six-pack** rings

- **⊠** Lamination film
- Silage or hay bags
- **⋈** Bedding or linen packaging
- Shiny, crinkly films like floral wrap or cellophane

Clear medium or large sized bags, no more than 3, of accepted plastic bags and film need to be placed next to the bins. The Fall River Stop & Shop manager requested the larger bags be placed next to the bin in the bottles/cans return room.
